Dear Assembly Member Limón,

The California State Association of Counties (CSAC), representing all 58 of the state's counties, writes in support of Assembly Bill 2803, which would help homeowners address the presence of lead-based paint in their homes.

Existing state law imposes liability for hazardous substances removal or remedial actions. The law allows parties affected by hazardous substances the ability to apply for compensation of loss caused by the release of hazardous waste. A homeowner of a property that has lead-based paint can recover damages for clean-up and/or require the responsible party to clean up the affected property. However, current law may allow the responsible party who incurs clean-up costs the right to also seek contribution and indemnity from others who are liable such as the injured private party – the homeowner.

AB 2803 would provide liability protections for homeowners whose homes are contaminated with lead-based paint. This would allow homeowners to seek damages for clean up or implement their own remediation efforts without fear of liability lawsuits. The result is more homeowners might be encouraged to act to remove hazardous lead-based paint from their homes and surrounding soils.
